FACT SHEET

ON-STREET GOVERNMENT PARKING PERMITS

IMPLEMENTATION March 1, 1987 permits valid

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM

BEFORE Over 100 types on-street parking permits existed
50,000 (estimate) documents or permits used
117 block area - 337 permits, 27 types
40 block area - 60 types of permits

AFTER Only 7 Government Permits will be recognized
Total number issued by agency are:

900	FBI
3,000	Federal Law Enforcement Offices (FLEO)
50	State Police
2,100	State Executive & Judicial
5,400	NYC Police
2,000	NYC Agency Business (Will increase)
<u>90</u>	NYC Official Business
13,540	TOTAL (will probably increase to 15,000)

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Must require on-street parking to perform official business during the business day.

Private cars must justify why government car is not available

REVIEW COMMITTEE

First Deputy Mayor's Office
Office of Operations
Dept. of Transportation

PRIVILEGES CONVEYED

Outside the No Permit Area eligible vehicles may park at "No Standing Except Trucks Loading & Unloading", "No Parking" and metered parking areas as outlined below:

Law enforcement	No time limit
Government	A maximum of 3 hours

NOT allowed: No Stopping, No Standing, Bus Stops, Bus Lanes, Fire Hydrants, Double Parking, Obstructing Traffic, No Permit Area

PROJECT BENEFITS

Provide additional space for truck deliveries
Reduce double parking
Eliminate blocked streets
Eliminate parking "Perks"
Assure only those cars needing permits get them

OTHER ELEMENTS OF AUTHORIZED PARKING PROGRAM

NO PERMIT AREA I August 18, 1986

Industrial area, travel corridors
91% reduction in official & Placard parking
Requested by merchants and Law Enforcement Parking Committee
400 summonses issued as of 2/20

NO PERMIT AREA II December 1, 1986

Chinatown
64% reduction in official & placard parking
Requested by the Chinatown Beautification Council
1200 summonses issued as of 2/20

NO PERMIT AREA III February 17, 1987

Courts and City Hall areas
Requested by merchants and government agencies
800 summonses issued during 1st week

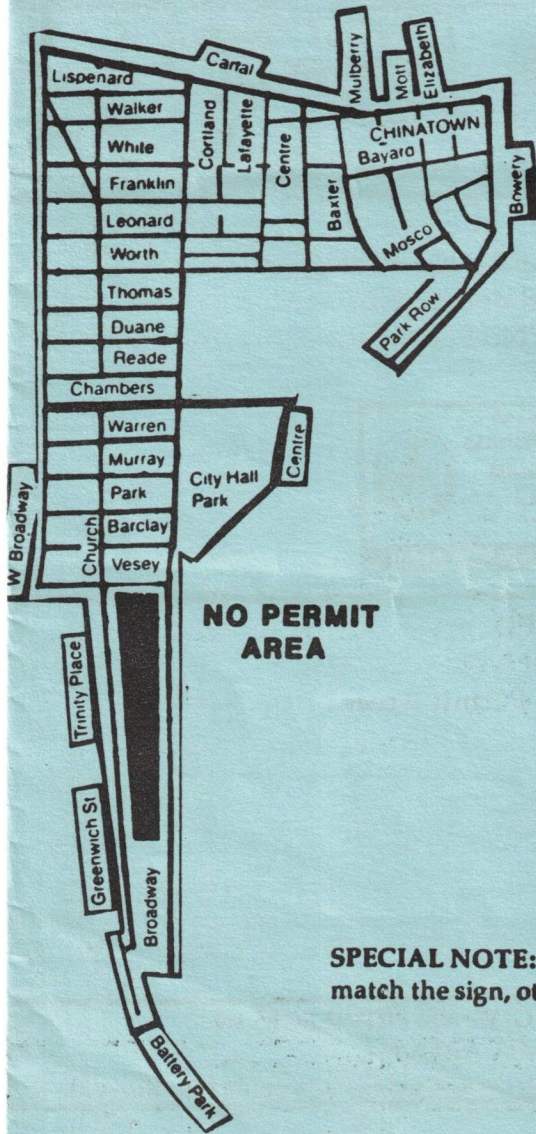

RECOGNIZED ON-STREET PARKING PERMITS FOR CARS

PERMITS GIVE NO PRIVILEGES IN "NO PERMIT AREA"

(Except SPI, Press and Movie permits are allowed).



GENERAL RULES:

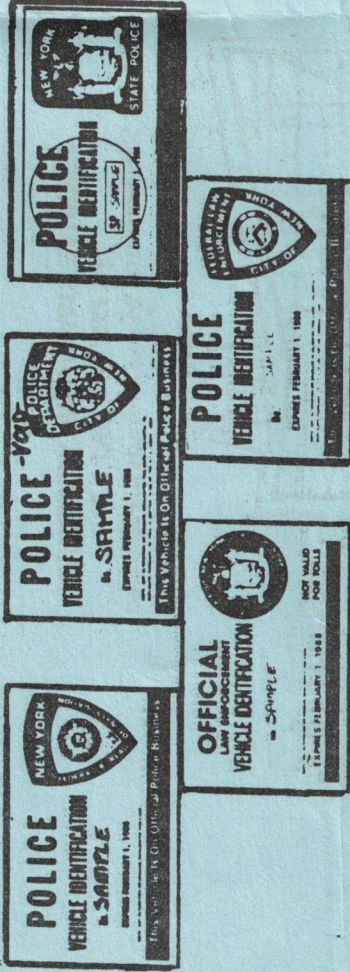
1. Only permits shown here are recognized by New York City.
2. NO EXCEPTIONS for:
No Stopping, No Standing, Bus Stops, Bus Lanes, Fire Hydrants, Double Parking, Obstructing Traffic.
3. Diplomats, Law Enforcement and Government vehicles, even with permits, may not park in the No Permit Area.
4. All trucks and vans with government license plates may park in No Standing Except Trucks and No Parking and Meter zones.
5. If you suspect abuse, please notify your supervisor or call the Office of Parking Control, (212)566-0900.

SPECIAL NOTE: At designated spaces, permits must match the sign, otherwise ticket and tow.

RECOGNIZED PERMITS:

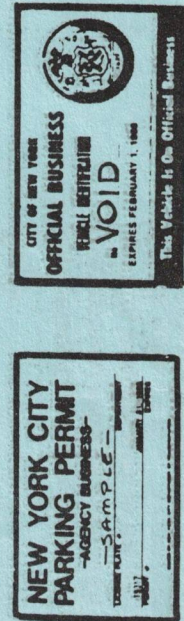
LAW ENFORCEMENT:

May park at all curbsides except those listed under "No Exceptions." May not park in "No Permit Area."



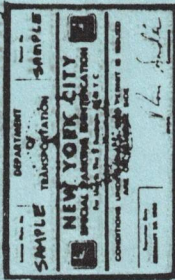
OTHER GOVERNMENT:

May park on Official Business for 3 hours at all curbsides except those listed under "No Exceptions." May not park in "No Permit Area."



HANDICAPPED DRIVERS (SPI):

May park at all curbsides except NO EXCEPTIONS. May park in No Permit Area.



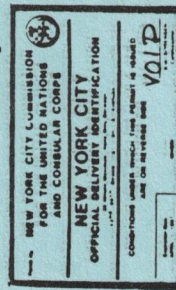
PRESS:

May park at all curbsides except "No Exceptions" when covering a news assignment. If you do not see news activity, summons after 1/2 hour; tow after 3 hours. Mark first observation on summons.



DIPLOMATS:

Allowed 30 minutes in No Authorized Parking Zone (42nd - 59th Sts., 3rd - 5th Avenues) at "No Standing Except Trucks Loading & Unloading." No privileges in other areas except as signed.



MOTION PICTURE:

Vehicles with Motion Picture Permits are exempted from these rules (except for hydrants) during a motion picture shoot. Scouting cars follow SPI rules.

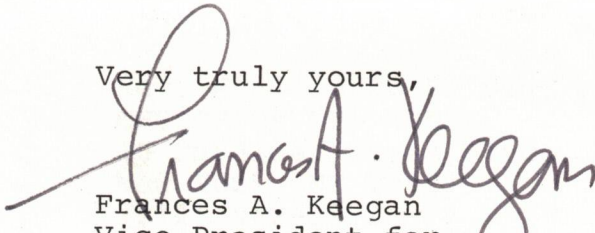
